**7. NEW BUSINESS**

**7.1 MOTION/PROCLAMATION 14-01: NATIONAL SERVICE RECOGNITION DAY**

Hanson stated that there has been an increase in national service. He stated that the proclamation is a way to recognize community and national service. Mayor Allen noted that there were several individuals in the audience who volunteer and provide services to the community. He stated that the proclamation is in recognition of all those who serve and provide service to the community and the nation.

**7.2 PRESENTATION: MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICT**

Council Member Jensen introduced Ryan Arkoudas from the Mosquito Abatement District. Council Member Jensen stated that Arkoudas has proven to be one of the better managers that he has been acquainted with at the District. He stated that the abatement initiative is very important to human health as well as animal's health. He stated that Arkoudas has the scientific knowledge and managerial skills needed to improve and enhance the program.

Arkoudas stated that the District's revenue comes strictly from taxes. Arkoudas delivered a mosquito education presentation to Council. He stated that the District is committed to the protection of the environment and uses Integrated Mosquito Management (IMM).

Council Member Jensen stated that anyone who has an ornamental pond can request the mosquito eating fish from the District and they will be provided as a courtesy. Arkoudas stated that the best protection from West Nile Virus is to free any areas with standing water. He stated that the mosquitos are very active during the night hours. He noted that the peak hours are from sundown (around 9:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m.).He stated that exposed skin should be covered with repellent. Mayor Allen thanked Council Member Jensen for his participation on the Board.

**7.3 PRESENTATION: COMMUNITIES THAT CARE PROGRAM UPDATE**

Leann Povey spoke briefly about legislative issues that presented themselves this year. She stated that the Program has been able to provide education and resources to those who have asked. Povey introduced two participants in the youth workgroup (Kodi Parkhurst and Bethany Michaels) who gave a presentation on environmental scans that have been done in the area.

Mayor Allen expressed his appreciation to Kodi and Bethany, as well as Council Member Johnston, who helped get the program off the ground a few years ago.
