Do you want to add a little recreation to your life? If you are interested in the Recreation program and want to sign up for a sport or activity, the web page is where you can do it. Simply click on *City Departments*, select *Parks and Recreation*, the first link you will come to will be the *Online Registration Form*...it's that easy.

Have you ever heard the phrase "There ought to be a law"? If there is a law; select "*City Code*" at the top right of the webpage. This resource gives you access to the laws that govern the City. - **Washington Terrace and South Ogden dog licenses available.**

- **Non-residents from all cities can attend.**

Rabies vaccinations are required by law, they can be administered at four months of age, and the first dose will be current for one full year from date of administration. Dr. Panter of Animal Care Clearfield will be on site administering rabies and core vaccines at a discount price for both dogs and cats of all ages, no appointment necessary.

Road Maintenance Projects in 2016

You will be pleased to learn that road maintenance/construction projects this summer will be limited to finalizing the work that ran late last year. Some valve covers and manhole lids will require adjustment, five areas still need a surface coating, and parking areas throughout the City will be repainted. One-to-two limited pipe replacement projects may also be bid out. These are all short duration efforts and more information will be submitted when plans are finalized.



Spring Cleanup

Our City-wide annual Spring Cleanup will be held April 18-21 this year. We will probably have plenty of yard waste to dispose after the winter we have had. A City map with the designated areas for collection each day and the preparation instructions for yard wastes will be published in the April Newsletter and on our City website. 2016 Recycle Pickup Schedule

The attached schedule will help you keep track of the weeks that the blue recycle waste container will be picked up at your home. Garbage will be picked up every Wednesday except when a holiday falls on the Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday of that week (Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, and the day after Christmas in 2016), when it will be picked up on Thursday. The blue recycle containers will be picked up that same day, but every-other-week.

Blue can pick up is scheduled by zone. Zone 1 (light rows) is the north half of Washington Terrace. Zone 2 (shaded rows) is the south half of Washington Terrace and includes all houses along 5000 South and to the south—including the bear's head on the west side of town. Please put only Recyclable materials into the blue cans. These include metals, clean paper/cardboard, and plastics. Call 801-395-8289 if you have questions.

Street Gutter Maintenance

We want to remind everyone that property upkeep and maintenance extends over the entire building lot and into the street. Our City is very appealing because this is happening at the vast majority of residences, thank you. It keeps taxes down and critical maintenance possible because of everyone's participation.

Please be aware that your help is needed in making sure: 1) Park strips are kept up; 2) Leaves, grass clippings, and other debris are cleaned/removed from the gutters along your property and not "swept" into the street; 3) Oils, greases, antifreeze, brake fluid, and hydraulic fluid are not leaked onto the road in front of your home. The latter group of pollutants not only leave a mess, but they damage/dissolve the asphalt roadway and cannot be legally washed into the storm water collection system.

Modest efforts on the part of each resident pay untold dividends in our quality of life here in "The Terrace".
