FIREWORK REMINDER



Legal July Dates:

July 2-5: In celebration of Independence Day

July 22-25: For Pioneer Day

On the mentioned dates, fireworks can be discharged between the hours of **11:00 AM** until **11:00 PM**. However, on **July 4th** and **July 24th** the time extends until **Midnight**.

Restricted Fireworks:

While many fireworks are legal to use, it's crucial to be aware of the prohibited items within Washington Terrace City.

The following fireworks are NOT allowed for use by the general public:

- Firecracker
- Roman Candles
- Aerial Salutes
- Bottle Rockets
- Rockets

Fireworks Safety Guidelines:

In the interest of public safety, we urge everyone to follow these essential guidelines:

- Always follow the instructions provided by the firework manufacturer.

- Never allow children to handle or ignite fireworks.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of a fire or other mishap.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move away quickly.
- Never try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks.



STORM WATER

Automobiles Reducing Storm Water Pollution

On July 15, 1903, Henry Ford sold his first automobile, just a month after the Ford Motor Company was created. In the past 121 years American society has built itself, almost inextricably, around cars. Automotive vehicles offer freedom of movement and transportation, but they also come with increased risk for water pollution. For example, a single pint of motor oil can create a slick on approximately one acre of water. Automotive fluids from leaks, spills, and dumps are one of the largest sources of pollution in America. Fortunately, there are ways to limit this risk for pollution.



Vehicle Washing

To prevent contaminated runoff, wash vehicles at a dedicated car wash facility. If at home, wash them on lawn or other landscaped surface that will prevent runoff and filter the flow.

Vehicle Maintenance

Automotive maintenance must be performed on impervious surfaces (away from storm drains) that can be cleaned if spills occur. Auto fluids must NEVER be dumped down storm drains or allowed to run into the gutters. Recycle used oil FOR FREE at local used oil collection points such as auto part stores.

Vehicle Storage

Long-term automotive storage should be restricted to impervious surfaces to prevent leak infiltration to soil. If leaks occur, even on impervious surfaces, the pollutant must be cleaned immediately to prevent contaminated runoff from reaching the stormwater system and the Weber River.

CONSTRUCTION CORNER

The 300 West Road Reconstruction Project has begun and is anticipated to be completed by October 1, 2024. The impacted area of the project will go from 5000 South to the Riverdale border (approx. 4400 S). As 300 West is a main corridor through Washington Terrace, reconstruction will ensure longevity, safety and reduce future repair costs.

The scope of the project includes removing and replacing the asphalt road section, replacing curb and gutter, replacing various sections of sidewalk and eliminating trip hazards. Reconstruction of 300 West is a major project that will require traffic detours and road closures during construction.
